Hopeful not Helpless

Bishop Boyea has continued an effort begun by Bishop Mengeling to bring to the Diocese information and resources to help understand and deal with the challenge of pornography in our society. Children, teens, and adults are confronted daily with this reality which threatens to deaden our most basic abilities to love and be loved in the way intended by God.

A diocesan committee to develop a pastoral response to pornography has been working for nearly two years to provide practical resources for parish leaders and parishioners. An overview of this effort appeared in the January-February issue of **FAITH Magazine**. A resource for adults will be featured in the March issue of **FAITH**. Subsequent resources will become available for young adults, for middle school and high school teens, for grade school children, and for parents/families. Each set of resources will be featured in a shortened form in **FAITH Magazine**. Each resource:

- analyzes some aspect of pornography,
- discusses society’s attitude that viewing pornography is “innocent activity”,
- cites current research about the harmful effects of pornography,
- shows what the Church teaches about sexuality and the dignity of the human person,
- encourages living a chaste life in world which includes pornography,
- and provides avenues for getting help for people who are addicted to pornography.

POPE'S STATEMENT ON EUTHANASIA

Ending a person's life is "false" solution to the problem of suffering, and one not worthy of human dignity says Benedict XVI. The Holy Father said the answer isn't putting a person out of their misery, however "kindly" they do it, "but to bear witness to the love that helps us to face pain and agony in a human way." "We are certain," Benedict XVI affirmed, "no tear, whether it be of those who suffer or those who stand by them, goes unnoticed before God." The Pope entrusted those who are suffering and their caretakers to the Virgin Mary, who "carried in her mother's heart the Son's secret, she shared in the painful moments of the passion and crucifixion, sustained by the hope of the resurrection."

CONTRACEPTIVE PILL

Eighty-five-year-old Carl Djerassi, the Austrian chemist who helped invent the contraceptive pill, now says that his co-creation has led to a "demographic catastrophe." The Austrian chemist was one of three whose formulation of the synthetic progestogen Norethisterone marked a key step toward the earliest oral contraceptive pill. Djerassi outlined the "horror scenario" that occurred because of the population imbalance, for which his invention was partly to blame. He said that in most of Europe there was now "no connection at all between sexuality and reproduction." He said: "This divide in Catholic Austria, a country which has on average 1.4 children per family, is now complete."

RESTORATIVE JUSTICE

Matthew 25:36 encourages us to visit the imprisoned. We are told that we visit the Lord Himself when we do so. God loves all of us (see Luke 15) and so it is with joy that we enter the prison to visit those confined.

Frequently, those who are in prison have no one who will visit them. This is so for a variety of reasons. It may be that the person has committed a crime which has caused shame to a family and they will not visit or, perhaps, the family lives at a great distance from the prison and cannot afford to make the trip to the prison. Smaller groups are “lifers” whose families have died or moved away. Whatever the reason, many welcome the opportunity to be involved with outreach volunteers who bring them God’s Word and a friendly smile. There are many people in prison who have a hunger for the faith. Outreach Volunteers bring RCIA to those within the prison walls who are seeking as well as those who desire to grow in their faith. It is our deep concern that the number of volunteers has diminished with the downturn in the economy. I have received telephone calls from prison chaplains who are concerned about the lack of volunteers as well.

The Office of Restorative Justice is concerned with all aspects of the continuum of crime and incarceration. As a church, we are concerned of the spiritual, physical and emotional needs of all. In the USCCB statement on Responsibility, Rehabilitation, and Restoration, the Bishops remind us that our work is to focus on the restoration of “a sense of civility and responsibility to everyday life, and promote crime prevention and genuine rehabilitation.” (If you would like a free copy of this statement, contact the Office of Restorative Justice at 517-342-2495.)

The Office of Restorative Justice works to move the hearts of the Catholic community to recognize victims of crime, those incarcerated and their families as brothers and sisters. This office seeks to treat all persons involved with or touched by crime as worthy of time, compassion and spiritual healing and to create programs necessary to facilitate restitution and rehabilitation. Specifically, this office targets the needs of the ex-offender, offenders under sentence, victims of offenders and families of offenders. Restoration to society as a productive member for the ex-offender, counsel and support for victims, support and reunification with the offender, if possible, for families, and the benefit of the sacraments for those incarcerated are the primary goals of this office. RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE MISSION OF JESUS AND THE CHURCH

This call to active participation by the laity in the mission of the Church has foundation in Scripture:

a. Each one of you has received a special grace, so like good stewards responsible for all these different graces of God, put yourselves at the service of others. *1 Peter 4:10*

b. The Spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me.

He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives, and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favor. *Luke 4:18-19*

The mission of Jesus is clearly defined in this passage from the Gospel of Luke and in turn defines the mission of every local church. Those in parish leadership might ask these questions:

- Who are the poor in our parish? How do we bring good news to them?
- Who are the captives in our parish? How do we bring them liberty?
- Who are the blind in our parish? How do we help them recover sight?
- Who are the downtrodden in our parish? How do we set them free?

As Matthew's Gospel says, "Why, then, do you stand here all the day idle?"

Matt. 20:6

We should not stand all day idle.

PASTORAL PLANNING

WHAT IS A SACRAMENTAL MINISTER?

Although widely used, "sacramental minister" is a recent term of convenience rather than a term in canon law.

It developed in response to situations where parishes or other communities of the faithful were to be served by "pastoral coordinators" instead of resident pastors (see canon 517 §2). The bishop entrusted these coordinators, who were not priests, with participating in the exercise of pastoral care and certain functions of leadership and administration that did not require priestly ordination. The bishop also designated "priest moderators" to mentor them. Typically, the moderator of the curia or the pastor of an adjacent parish served as the canonical (legal) pastor.



Other priests, termed "sacramental ministers," were appointed and authorized by the bishop to provide sacramental and pastoral care that requires priestly orders to the faithful of those communities on a stable basis. While they did not govern the parish as a pastor would, they carried out the sanctifying functions that a pastor would and many of the teaching functions. They celebrated the Eucharist, heard confessions, and anointed the sick. They also baptized, assisted at marriage, administered viaticum, and conducted funeral rites.

Today, the second of the three cluster models in "Planning Tomorrow's Churches" maintains this possibility of sacramental ministers. In any case, it is important to avoid viewing sacramental ministers just functionally. The exercise of their sacred ministry arises from their configuration to Christ (a sacramental identity) by virtue of their priestly ordination.

The Review is an opportunity to give concrete, practical direction to the faith formation aspects of your parish=s goals which were derived from doing the **Parish Assessment Tool**, its annual updates and now the **Parish Evaluation Inventory**. It also relates to the concept of having parish catechetical plan (**National Directory for Catechesis**, par. 255). This will result in a more detailed picture of where your parish wants to go in developing its faith formation programs for adults, teens and children over the next 5-7 years.
