**FAREWELL TO MONSIGNOR ROBERT LUNSFORD  
AND FATHER MATTHEW FEDEWA**

**REV. MSGR. ROBERT**

**LUNSFORD**, a native of Lansing,  
was ordained to the priesthood in  
Rome, Italy on December 18, 1960,  
following studies at Sacred Heart  
Seminary, Detroit where he received  
a B.A. in Scholastic Philosophy and  
North American College, Rome,  
earning a S.T.B. from the Gregorian  
University. He will have Senior  
Status, June 29, 2005.



While pastor of St. Joseph Parish, St.

Johns, MI, he was named a Prelate of Honor to His Holiness, with the title  
"Monsignor" in 1999. That same year he assumed the position of Diocesan  
Chancellor.

Prior to his assignment to St. Johns, Msgr. Lunsford was the pastor of  
St. Thomas the Apostle Parish in Ann Arbor, and Co-Rector of St. Mary  
Cathedral in Lansing. He has also been the Superintendent of Education  
for the diocese and associate pastor at Holy Redeemer, Flint and St.  
Mary Cathedral, Lansing. In addition, he has earned a masters degree in  
Religious Education summa cum laude from Fordham University, NY.

He will be residing in DeWitt, Michigan.

**MICHIGAN PRISONER  
RE-ENTRY INITIATIVE**  
**Goal 5, Strategy D: Provide appropriate social justice outreach education and formation to parish and diocesan volunteers and staff.**

With the strong support of Bishop Mengeling, the Office of Restorative Justice is involved in a major drive to acquire and train dozens of parishioners to mentor ex-offenders upon their return to society. Meetings of priests, deacons and prison volunteers have been exposed to a new attitude from the State about the place of the faith community in changing the high recidivism rate of Michigan offenders. Volunteer mentors will be trained to serve the needs of those returning from prison or jail without family support. The Department of Corrections is looking to all faith communities to act as mentors. A qualified mentor will be trained to represent the diocese in the process of re-entry months before the prisoner returns to the streets. All mentors will be thoroughly trained, always work in pairs and only do that which they feel confident they can handle. The Vatican statement announced that the message will reflect further on the legacy of the Second Vatican Council's pastoral constitution "Gaudium et Spes," published 40 years ago this December.

## CCMI DAY RETREAT A SUCCESS!

**Goal 1.1, Strategy B: Ensure every person will have a specific experience of being invited, welcomed and nurtured into the parish community.**

The first-ever Christians Concerned About Mental Illness (CCMI) retreat was held at St Francis Retreat Center in DeWitt on Wednesday, June 29. More than twenty persons with mental illness and family members, friends and caregivers attended the retreat. Denise Farmer, social worker at Catholic Social Services in Jackson, was at the event to provide assistance as necessary. Fr. Tom McDevitt facilitated the morning talk and celebrated Mass with the participants. Fr. McDevitt had his 47th anniversary of his ordination on the same day as the retreat and offered reflections on Scriptures that elaborated the theme for the Day Retreat, "Here I Am, Lord." In the afternoon, Valerie Smith and Denise Garrison of Payee Resources Inc. of Mason presented a thorough overview of services and financial assistance available through the State of Michigan as well as their agency. They help persons with mental illness and other disabilities develop a system to pay bills and other financial obligations on the limited income available from the state for SSI and SSDI payments. Joann Davis, director of Ministry with Persons with disabilities for the Diocese of Lansing, concluded the day with meditation and reflection. She then offered participants the opportunity to create unique works of art to remind attendees of their gratitude to God. The Day Retreat was made possible in part from a Family Mini-Grant available from the Department of Catholic Charities for the Diocese of Lansing. Many participants voiced their approval of making this retreat an annual event. CCMI meets from September-May on the 4th Tuesday of each month (excluding December), from 12:00-1:00pm at the Diocesan Center in Lansing. 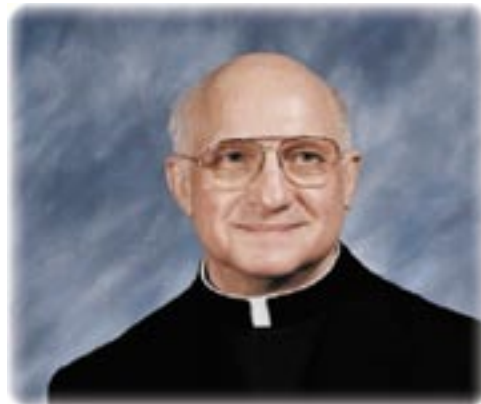
## FAREWELL AND WELCOME!!!

Fr. Matt was ordained to the Diocese of Lansing in 1958. He served as Parochial Vicar of St. Robert, Flushing, St. Agnes, Flint, St. Philip, Battle Creek, and St. Mary, Kalamazoo. Between his assignments to St. Agnes and St. Philip, he was Secretary to Bishop Albers.

Fr. Matt next began a career in Catholic education serving as chaplain and head of the Religious Education Department at O'Rafferty High School in Lansing. When that school was closed for consolidation into a single area-wide Catholic high school, Fr. Matt instituted the Area Religious Education Program (AREP) for 700 Catholic students attending public high schools. Later, he began a similar program in the Ann Arbor-Ypsilanti area. It was also during this time that he started the Teens Encountering Christ (TEC) program that has achieved national recognition and is offered in dioceses throughout the country.

In 1975, Fr. Matt was named pastor of St. Michael in Flint where he remained until 1991 when he became pastor of St. Mary, Morrice. In 2001, Bishop Mengeling asked Fr. Matt to chair the Department of Formation for the diocese.

Fr. Matt holds a STL from Catholic University of America, a Master's in Religious Education from Loyola of Chicago and a Doctor of Ministry from St. Mary Seminary University of Baltimore.

For anyone desiring to contact him, Fr. Matt will be in residence and helping out at St. Gerard Parish in Lansing. We all wish Fr. Matt the best in his retirement and know that he will continue to direct his creative talents to the good of God's kingdom.

**SR. MARY ANN FOGGIN, SGL** is a member of the Servants of God's Love, a charismatic, diocesan community located in Ann Arbor.
