

Oftentimes throughout this process the question is asked: "Are you going to publish good ideas from what's happening in our parishes at the end of the process? Things that a parish is doing particularly well?" We have had a process in place since March 2006 called [*SHARE THE WEALTH*](#). This initiative is an attempt to feature monthly some worthwhile program in one of our parishes that could be done easily in any parish interested in doing so. It is something like "best practices in the parishes of the Diocese of Lansing".

Ideas have been gleaned from parish pastoral plan reports, parish bulletins and parish ministers who may have put us in touch with what they are doing. The articles are written by local writers who contact the individual in the parish who has responsibility for a particular idea. As much information as can be learned is captured in a couple pages on the Share the Wealth page of the diocesan website (www.dioceseoflansing.org). The names of parish contacts are listed should anyone want more information. There are now 24 articles listed, covering topics such as evangelization and some unique ways in which it is being done in a number of our parishes, faith formation ideas, social ministry ideas, vocation ministry ideas and spirituality ideas.

Hopefully, parishes will find this resource useful to deepen their life and mission. A preview of the upcoming article is advertised in *FAITH* magazine and in *VOICES ALIVE*.



PLANNING TOMORROW'S CHURCHES ... WHERE WE ARE AND WHAT'S NEXT

The Regional Review Committees completed their work in the last few months. Records indicate that 93 faith communities completed the PEI process and 90 faith communities held parish assemblies during which parishioners were informed of the results of the regional review process.

Beginning November 2007, the process moved to the Diocesan Coordinating Commission level. The review process at the diocesan level is a comprehensive one. Each individual parish report resulting from the PEI process, each parish assembly report and the regional report are studied by Commission members. Any correspondence received in the Office of Pastoral Planning related to the outcome of the parish or regional review are also distributed to the Commission members. Demographic statistics accompany each parish report.

In dialogue with the regional vicar, the Commission makes every effort humanly possible to thoroughly understand the effectiveness of the life and mission of the church within each region. The Commission approaches the review with two intentions: (1) to grasp what is happening now in the local parishes within the region, and (2) what the needs of the future are. The vicars have been asked to provide the Commission with an overview of the regional review process in the region and to include any facts pertinent to the *Planning Tomorrow's Churches* process. Any lacunae in the regional process have been cited and recorded for further deliberation. Each individual observation made in the regional report is reviewed in great depth during Commission meetings. The work, while being tedious, is somewhat rewarding. We have learned about many effective ministries throughout various parts of the diocese and we have learned that there remains much work to do. Some of the work is beginning in the regions. Other suggestions will need further deliberation and will need approval from the Bishop of the diocese before implementation can begin.

To date, the Commission has completed its initial review of the Lenawee, Livingston, Jackson, Washtenaw and Lansing Regions. Genesee County and Shiawassee County are scheduled for review during the February meeting of the Commission.

What's next, you may ask? After all regions have been reviewed, the Commission will take a comprehensive look at what has been learned. Issues have been identified along the way which will need resolution. When a draft plan is complete, the Bishop's consultative bodies (Presbyteral Council, Diocesan Pastoral Council, Council of Vicars, Diocesan Finance Council and College of Consultators) will review the draft recommendations resulting from the entire review process. These draft recommendations will be revised as needed before being presented to the Bishop of Lansing for approval sometime in June 2008.

EARNED INCOME TAX CREDIT

The **Earned Income Tax Credit** and the **Child Tax Credit** are federal benefits for low and moderate-income workers. Families with children who earned less than \$38,000 and single households earning less than \$13,000 can qualify for up to \$4,716. In addition some families can also get up to \$1,000 per child. RESTORATIVE JUSTICE

Michigan has over 51,000 people incarcerated in the state prison system. Of those, 5,246 are Catholic. The evidence of juvenile incarceration is not much better. There are many factors that influence these numbers. Perhaps the most startling data shows that 70% of children of incarcerated offenders will someday be incarcerated themselves. This is certainly a startling number considering that Michigan is one of the nation's leaders in people sentenced to prison. Somehow this cycle of incarceration must be broken. The Diocese of Lansing, Office of Restorative Justice, is working toward this goal through its Ministry to Families and Children of the Incarcerated. OSTRACIZED - BUT NOT FORGOTTEN

Livingston County Catholic Social Services (LCCSS), along with most of the other Catholic Charities agencies of the Diocese of Lansing, are actively providing services to prison parolees. At LCCSS, we are providing Mental Health and Substance Abuse Outpatient Counseling to parolees returning to the local community. Due to overcrowding and insufficient funding, many prisoners fail to receive adequate services to address long-term mental health and addiction problems during their incarceration. Often these problems, especially alcohol and drug addiction, were contributing factors to the original criminal behavior. If left untreated, the risk of returning to criminal activity increases.

LCCSS has always had a special mission to serving the poor, near-poor and those who fall through the cracks of our society. Unfortunately, many prison parolees meet one or more of these characteristics. Catholic Charities agencies can serve a unique role in the lives of these individuals because of the variety of services that we provide. Most of our agencies can respond to both the mental health and the addiction needs that the parolee may have. In addition, we can provide family therapy, marital counseling and other supportive services that the parolee or their family can benefit from. Along with clinical counseling, the typical parolee often needs a job and a safe place to live. LCCSS has collaborative working relationships with local service providers for these and many other services. The State of Michigan pays for the mental health and substance abuse counseling for many parolees, but the supportive services for family members are covered by the DSA, the local United Way and agency fundraising. Thus, these services are one more example of successful collaboration among people of Faith, our government and the broader community.

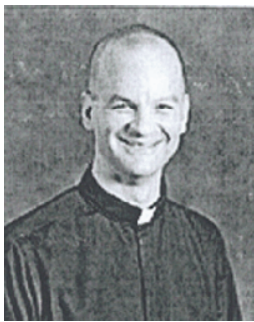

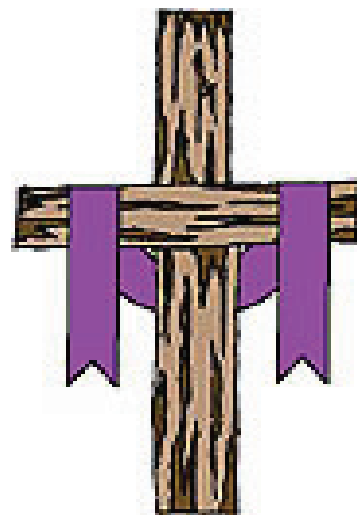
