

We encourage all Catholics in our diocese to pray with Bishop Boyea as he deliberates the future of our parishes.

The second phase of *Planning Tomorrow's Churches* is expected to strengthen the life and mission of individual parishes. Following the promulgation of the results of *Planning Tomorrow's Churches*, every parish will be asked to submit to the Office of Pastoral Planning an updated pastoral plan. This pastoral plan is expected to reflect the information gathered in the PEI process at the parish and regional level through the identification of the necessary goals and strategies. Secondly, regions will be asked to come together to plan for the implementation of regional agenda. One challenge will be to respond to these goals and strategies with the necessary resources. It is our hope that through these intentional planning initiatives, the Church of Lansing will deepen its response to the needs of all those we serve and that our people will respond to the call to wholeness and holiness in these challenging times.



PLANNING TOMORROW'S CHURCHES . . . SOME REFLECTIONS

The Church of Lansing began in a renewed and intentional way to plan for its future in 1999. As reflected in *Novo Millennio Ineunte* we asked the question "what must we do?" We took up the challenge of John Paul II: "The program of the Gospel must continue to take root, but it is in the local churches that the specific features of a detailed pastoral plan can be identified – goals and methods, formation and enrichment of the people involved, the search for the necessary resources – which will enable the proclamation of Christ to reach people, mold communities and have a deep and incisive influence in bringing Gospel values to bear in society and culture." This was the incentive that brought about **VOICES** during 1999 - 2000. The outcome of this massive listening process is our Diocesan Pastoral Plan promulgated on March 26, 2002.

During the 5 year period following the promulgation of the plan, parishes were encouraged to deepen their life and mission through implementing their particular pastoral plan which resulted from individual parish listening sessions. Then in Fall 2005 focus was shifted to goal 4.2 of the plan: *to effectively deploy clergy to improve sacramental and pastoral ministry*. Upon the advice of pastoral leadership across the diocese, the Diocesan Coordinating Commission was appointed by Bishop Mengeling to "... design a process which will ensure that the pastoral, sacramental and leadership needs of our people are met." The process began with an extensive internal examination of each parish and parish school through the PEI/SEI process. Regional Review Committees were convened to review each parish in the region and assist parishes in identifying strengths and weaknesses as well as regional goals resulting from the information gathered. Finally, the Diocesan Coordinating Commission reviewed the results of the Regional Review Committees in consultation with Regional Vicars. The results of these consultations were then formulated into draft recommendations in four categories: parish configurations, regional facts and agenda, formation issues and parking lot issues.

The final piece of consultation was held with the Presbyteral Council, College of Consultors, Council of Vicars, Diocesan Pastoral Council and Diocesan Finance Council. The Coordinating Commission has reviewed the results of these consultations and has submitted its final recommendations to Bishop Boyea.

RESTORATIVE JUSTICE

As we approach the November elections, our thoughts are drawn toward the relationship that the Catholic Church has with the secular world of government. Politicians are proclaiming that he or she has the answer to all of the serious problems that our society faces whether it be financial, social or otherwise. Arguments arise over which politician can fulfill promises. Each of us studies the candidates to see if they fit our norms.

Standing alone in this wilderness of confusion is the Catholic Church as a beacon for the oppressed, lonely and forgotten in society. Here is perhaps one of the greatest needs that our society faces today. Each week, men and women who have paid a debt for a wrong they committed are released from prison to come home. Will they come home to a community that welcomes or shuns them? Will they be allowed to work or be denied the right to support themselves? Will they be welcomed as our neighbors or castigated and forced to move to the worst neighborhoods? Many will return to prison because they find society too difficult.

Faithful Citizenship

Independence Day has passed and we are moving towards the national political conventions. Several months ago our bishops issued their pastoral statement, *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility*. It is an excellent resource that all adults could use as they determine who should receive their vote. Now the USCCB has launched a new Faithful Citizenship website as an online resource (www.faithfulcitizenship.org). The site has material specially designed for educators including planning ideas for parishes, prayer and worship suggestions, ideas for social concerns and respect life committees, resource links for taking action, political guidelines and links to downloadable clip art.

CRIMINAL RECORD BACKGROUND CHECK

Common Strategy 3: Assist every parish to develop a plan to improve communication.

Employees must have a criminal background check with livescan fingerprinting before a contract is signed. Volunteers who have four or more hours per month contact with minors on a regular basis must have a criminal background check. If the volunteer has lived in the state of Michigan 10 consecutive years, counting back from the current year, fingerprinting is not required. If the volunteer has lived in the state of Michigan less than 10 consecutive years, livescan fingerprinting is required. Background check procedures and necessary forms are available at: http://www.dioceseoflansing.org/safe_environment/index.html. Call: Sally Ellis at 517-342-2551.

- **All** full and part-time employees are required to attend one Protecting God's Children Awareness Session for Adults (PGC) and complete a background check with fingerprinting [page 10 of Employee Handbook].
- Employees hired previous to October 1, 2007, should have read and signed the Code of Pastoral Conduct. Effective October 1, 2007, the code of conduct for employees was revised and is found in the Employee Handbook. [Employee Handbook, Section II, paragraph C, pages 10 - 11.]
- **All** volunteers who have contact with minors are required to attend one PGC session, preferably before the volunteer begins to serve.
- "Before a volunteer who regularly will have four or more monthly hours of contact with minors begins to serve, a criminal background check will be conducted. The criminal background check on such a volunteer will include fingerprinting unless the volunteer has resided continuously in the state of Michigan for the preceding ten years." [Sec. II, par. B in Employee Handbook]
