#### From the Vatican:

### NEW PREFECT NAMED FOR THE CONGREGATION FOR DIVINE WORSHIP AND THE DISCIPLINE OF THE SACRAMENTS

On Sunday, 23 November 2014, the Holy Father named Cardinal Robert Sarah as Prefect for the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments. Cardinal Sarah has been serving as President of the Pontifical Council 'Cor Unum'.

Robert Sarah was born in Ourous in the archdiocese of Conakry in Guinea, on June 15, 1945. He was ordained priest on July 20, 1969 and was then sent to Rome, where he obtained a licentiate in theology from the Pontifical



Gregorian University. He also studied at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome and obtained a licentiate in Sacred Scriptures from the Studium Biblicum Franciscanum in Jerusalem. He returned to Guinea where he served as a parish priest and then rector of the junior seminary of Kindia. He was appointed archbishop of Conakry on August 13, 1979, where he served until October 2001 when he was appointed secretary of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples. On October 7, 2010, Pope Benedict XVI appointed him president of the 'Cor Unum' Pontifical Council and was created cardinal in the consistory of November 20, 2010 with the title of Cardinal Deacon of the church of San Giovanni Bosco in via Tuscolana. 'Cor Unum' is the agency of the Holy See responsible for coordinating the organizations and charitable activities promoted by the Catholic Church. On December 29, 2010, Cardinal Sarah was appointed a member of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, Pontifical Council for the Laity, and the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace.

#### **USCCB Update**:

### SUMMARY OF USCCB FALL GENERAL ASSEMBLY ACTIONS ON LITURGICAL MATTERS

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) 2014 Fall General Assembly was held in Baltimore November 10-13. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Divine Worship presented five liturgical items for vote, all of which were approved:

• A revision to the Guidelines for the Celebration of the Sacraments with Persons with Disabilities.

A document first published by the U.S. Bishops in 1995, the Committee sought permission to revise *Guidelines for the Celebration of the Sacraments with Persons with Disabilities* in light of medical developments and increased awareness of some of the challenges faced by Catholics today. One example of such a challenge is the greater awareness today of those with gluten intolerance (Celiac disease) and the need to continue to provide for their sacramental and spiritual needs. Upon the approval of the Bishops, the Committee on Divine Worship, working closely with the Committee on Canonical Affairs and Church Governance as well as the Committee on Evangelization and

Catechesis, will begin the work of revision immediately for future approval by the bishops at a general meeting.

• A revised translation of The Order of the Dedication of a Church and an Altar.

Promulgated in Latin in 1977 and first translated in 1989, the Latin edition of this book was slightly modified in 1983 with the publication of the *Code of Canon Law*. This rite is used whenever a new church is built or when a new altar is made. The ritual mirrors the rite of baptism, washing and anointing the building and altar, rendering them fit for worship in the same way that the Christian is washed and anointed in baptism, thereby becoming fit for sacramental worship, too. The revised English translation incorporates the modifications from the *Code of Canon Law* as well as bringing the translation into conformity with the *Roman Missal*, *Third Edition*.

• The first ever official English translation of the ritual book *Exorcisms and Related Supplications*.

Revised after the Second Vatican Council, this ritual was promulgated in Latin in 1999 with an amended version in 2004. The main part of this book is the rite of major exorcism and includes an introduction outlining criteria for its use, which is always the decision of the bishop alone. While this text affirms the reality of evil in the world, it even more so affirms the sovereignty of Christ to overcome any and all evil.

An updated Supplement to the Liturgy of the Hours.

An English translation of the prayers used for the feast days of saints who have been added to the General Calendar since 1984.

• Changes to the Revised Grail Psalter.

There have been several changes to the *Grail Psalter* even after it was approved for liturgical use by the USCCB and received the *recognitio* from the Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments (2010). Most of these changes were made to improve the rhythm of the text and, therefore, make them easier to sing.

#### DIOCESE OF LANSING CALENDAR ADVISORY 2015

The Office of Worship recently released the *Diocese of Lansing Calendar Advisory* 2015. This year's calendar advisory includes dates of special interest in the Diocese of Lansing, including the feast of the Dedication of St Mary's Cathedral (December 9), the dates of the Rite(s) of Election, as well as the Diaconate and Presbyteral Ordinations. Also, for the first time, the complete *Necrology of the Priests and Deacons of the Diocese of Lansing* is integrated into the calendar as a daily reminder to keep the deceased clergy of our diocese in prayer. As a further aid to daily prayer, the monthly General and Evangelization intentions of the Holy Father are included as well.

Holy Week: Easter Vigil

#### THE TIME OF THE EASTER VIGIL

he first Mass of Easter, the Easter Vigil, is celebrated between nightfall of Holy Saturday, April 4, 2015 and daybreak of Easter Sunday, April 5, 2015.

Civil twilight on Saturday, April 4, 2015 will end in the Diocese of Lansing at 8:38 PM. Thus, the earliest time for the beginning of the Easter Vigil is <u>8:45 PM.</u>

According to the Circular Letter *Paschale Solemnitatis* (On the Preparation and Celebration of the Paschal Feasts) from the Congregation for Divine Worship (no. 78):

"The entire celebration of the Easter Vigil takes place at night. It should not begin before nightfall; it should end before daybreak on Sunday." This rule is to be taken according to its strictest sense. Reprehensible are those abuses and practices which have crept into many places in violation of this ruling, whereby the Easter Vigil is celebrated at the time of day that it is customary to celebrate anticipated Sunday Masses.

Those reasons which have been advanced in some quarters for the anticipation of the Easter Vigil, such as lack of public order, are not put forward in connection with Christmas night, nor other gatherings of various kinds."

The careful reading of this document is imperative for all those who prepare, preside over, or participate in the great liturgical celebrations from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost.
